Stroke Thrombolysis Thrombectomy Guidelines

Patients currently receiving oral anticoagulants, e.g. warfarin with an INR >1.7 Administration of heparin at therapeutic dose within the previous 48 hours Platelet count of below 100,000/mm³ (wait for result only if suspected) Seizure (only if clinical diagnosis of stroke is then in doubt)
Systolic blood pressure >185 mmHg or diastolic blood pressure >110 mmHg Known significant ...
